THE SAINSBURY SCHOLARSHIP OFFERS

- a prestigious award for young painters and sculptors of outstanding promise
- one year's residence at the BSR (late September 2020–mid September 2021)
- a spacious and well-lit studio
- board and lodging plus an allowance (a grant of £800 per month; plus a grant for travel in Italy of £1,200)
- membership of a vibrant residential community of artists and researchers

YOU WILL BE

- a promising and ambitious painter or sculptor
- a graduate in Fine Art (or expect to have graduated in Fine Art before 1 October 2020)
- under **32** years of age on 1 October 2020
- a British national or have been working professionally after having graduated and/or studying at postgraduate level for at least the last five years in the UK (i.e. since January 2015); and must be able to demonstrate an intention, upon completion of the Scholarship, to work in the UK or otherwise to contribute to the wider UK artistic community
- able to show the importance of a residency in Rome for your practice
- able to submit a portfolio of recent drawings and examples of either paintings or sculptures
- keen to share the benefits of a residential community

The BSR reserves the right to alter any aspect of the residencies and competitions.

The panel's decision is final; and feedback cannot be given on unsuccessful applications.
